Right-wing journalist and TalkRadio mid-morning host — one of the most recognisable right-wing media voices in the UK. A former political editor of the Sunday Express and columnist for The Daily Telegraph and The Guardian, she bridges traditional print journalism, mainstream broadcast (TalkRadio since 2016, formerly LBC) and the new right-wing media ecosystem as a frequent GB News contributor. Her combative, opinion-driven presenting style is reliably Conservative on immigration, Brexit and culture war issues; she was strongly pro-Brexit through the referendum campaign and is a regular critic of the BBC, the Labour Party and left-wing activism. Controversies include describing Islam as "a misogynistic, homophobic, antisemitic death cult" and accusations of transphobia. She is one of the few broadcasters explicitly described as "right-wing" in their Wikipedia lead, and reaches a large daily radio audience she has held for over a decade.

Role in Ecosystem

Julia Hartley-Brewer is one of the most recognisable right-wing media voices in the UK, hosting the mid-morning show on TalkRadio. Over a three-decade career she has written for The Daily Telegraph, The Guardian, the Sunday Express, and appeared on BBC's Question Time, Any Questions, and The Andrew Marr Show.

Her significance in the ecosystem is as a mainstream right-wing media personality who reaches a large daily radio audience (TalkRadio) and has done so consistently for over a decade. Her presenting style is combative, opinion-driven, and reliably Conservative/right-wing on immigration, Brexit, and culture war issues. She has been described by Wikipedia as a "right-wing English political journalist" — a rare explicit ideological labelling on the platform.

She bridges traditional print journalism (broadsheet columnist), broadcast (TalkRadio host), and the new right-wing media ecosystem (frequent GB News contributor).
