A former Homeland Party activist, he is now a key figure in the far-right realignment around Restore Britain, forming the "Laws-Wilkes" axis with close ally Steve Laws — the party's openly racist faction, which won the first round of the internal battle for the party's direction in May 2026. His significance is as a new-generation neo-nazi — young, online-native, YouTube-savvy — bridging the older Holocaust-denial tradition with the modern far-right content creator ecosystem and exemplifying the radicalisation of young men through online pipelines.

Role in Ecosystem

Sam Wilkes, known online as "Zoomer Historian", is a prominent neo-nazi content creator and Holocaust denier who has become a key figure in the far-right realignment around Restore Britain. According to HOPE not Hate, he is a "Hitler-apologist content creator" with over 171,000 YouTube subscribers. He was identified as being from Guernsey and only became politicised in the late 2010s through watching American far-right "groypers" such as Nick Fuentes.

Wilkes sees himself as the successor to David Irving, the notorious Holocaust denier. He has been a key ally of Steve Laws in the battle for the soul of Restore Britain, forming the "Laws-Wilkes" axis that Searchlight describes as the party's openly racist faction. The pair won the first round of that internal battle in May 2026.

His significance is as a new-generation neo-nazi — young, online-native, YouTube-savvy — who bridges the older Holocaust-denial tradition (Irving) with the modern far-right content creator ecosystem. He represents the radicalisation of young men through online far-right content pipelines.
