Background

Janice Raymond is an American radical feminist scholar whose 1979 book *The Transsexual Empire* is widely considered the original text of anti-trans feminism. The book argued that trans women are not women but rather male infiltrators of women's spaces, and that the medical establishment creates trans people through surgery and hormones as a patriarchal project. Raymond's work directly influenced US federal policy: her report to the National Center for Health Care Technology led to the exclusion of transition-related care from Medicare and Medicaid coverage in the 1980s — a policy that lasted decades.

Timeline

- **1979:** Published *The Transsexual Empire: The Making of the She-Male* — originally her PhD dissertation supervised by radical feminist theologian Mary Daly
- **1980:** Contracted by the National Center for Health Care Technology to produce a report on trans healthcare — recommended against public funding
- **1981:** Reagan administration excluded transition-related care from federal health programmes, citing Raymond's report
- **1994:** Second edition of *The Transsexual Empire* published

Ideology & Positions

- Radical feminist trans-exclusion: trans women are male-bodied people who appropriate female identity; transsexualism is a medical industry project that reinforces gender stereotypes
- Opposition to trans healthcare: argued transition is medically harmful and should not be publicly funded
- Sex work abolition: co-authored anti-sex work legislation and activism alongside anti-trans work
- Theological dimension: influenced by Mary Daly's radical feminist theology
