

Trudy Wells

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Semantic Summary

Trudy Wells is an Oxfordshire-based Raise the Colours (RTC) administrator whose role as "member and admin for Raise the Colours Oxfordshire" — as stated on her Instagram profile — places her within the organisational rather than confrontational wing of the far-right group. She was one of four RTC members named in the landmark High Court injunction obtained by Oxfordshire County Council in June 2026, alongside co-founder Ryan Bridge, organiser Ben Cullen, and Kevin Good, giving an undertaking to cease affixing flags to public infrastructure and not to obstruct council workers. Her Instagram presence (@trudy.wells.545, 159 followers) identifies her as a chapter admin, and in June 2026 — shortly before the court proceedings — she posted about a new page "taking over from Raise the Colours Oxfordshire" under the name "Flying the Flag Oxfordshire," suggesting an attempt to rebrand and continue activities under a different banner following legal pressure. A post referencing her daughter Ellie turning 23 indicates family connections in the area. Unlike the more publicly visible RTC figures such as Bridge with his multiple arrests or Keating with his documented street violence, Wells' role appears primarily administrative — managing social media, coordinating local flag-raising, and maintaining the Oxfordshire chapter's online presence. Her rebranding effort illustrates a common far-right adaptation tactic: when legal constraints foreclose activity under one name, the infrastructure shifts to another.

Trudy Wells is an Oxfordshire-based activist who served as admin for the Raise the Colours Oxfordshire chapter, identified via her Instagram profile @trudy.wells.545. She was one of four RTC members named as defendants in Oxfordshire County Council's landmark High Court injunction of June 2026, alongside Ryan Bridge, Ben Cullen, and Kevin Good, and gave an undertaking to the court to cease flag-raising on public infrastructure. Unlike the more confrontational RTC figures, Wells' role appears administrative and coordinating rather than physically aggressive — managing social media, organising local flag placements, and attempting a rebrand to "Flying the Flag Oxfordshire" shortly before the injunction, suggesting an effort to evade legal restrictions. Her Instagram presence (159 followers, 71 posts) reveals a local, family-oriented identity — she posted about her daughter Ellie turning 23 — alongside consistent St George's flag imagery. Wells represents the organisational backbone of RTC's regional chapters: the non-violent, administrative enablers who sustained the group's presence through social media management and local coordination while more notorious figures like Bridge and Keating generated headlines through

Overview

Trudy Wells is an Oxfordshire-based far-right activist and a named member of Raise the Colours (RTC), a British far-right group involved in flag-raising operations and anti-migrant vigilantism. She was identified as a "member and admin for Raise the Colours Oxfordshire" on her Instagram profile, indicating a leadership or organisational role within the group's Oxfordshire chapter.

Wells was one of four RTC members named in a High Court injunction granted to Oxfordshire County Council on 23 June 2026, alongside Ryan Bridge, Ben Cullen, and Kevin Good. The injunction, the first of its kind by a UK council, prohibited the named individuals from affixing flags to lampposts and other public infrastructure across Oxfordshire, from encouraging others to do so, and from obstructing council workers. Wells gave an undertaking to the court agreeing to these terms.

Her Instagram presence (handle @trudy.wells.545, 159 followers, 144 following, 71 posts) identifies her as an admin for the group. In June 2026, shortly before the court proceedings, she posted about a new page "taking over from Raise the Colours Oxfordshire" under the name "Flying the Flag Oxfordshire", suggesting an attempt to rebrand or continue activities under a different banner following legal pressure.

Background

Little is publicly documented about Wells' background prior to her involvement with Raise the Colours. Her Instagram activity suggests she is based in Oxfordshire and has a familial connection to the area — a post from June 2026 references her daughter Ellie turning 23.

She appears to have taken on an administrative role for the Oxfordshire chapter of RTC, managing social media accounts and coordinating local flag-raising activities.
