Tory leader attacks Burnham for nationalisation drive

KEMI: NEW PM WANTS TO TAKE US BACK TO 70s

KEMI Badenoch tore apart Andy Burnham's Commons debut as PM yesterday and warned: "He is living in the past and wants to take us back to the 1970s."

As he vowed Labour would be "relentless" in restoring public control of water and energy supplies, she accused him of looking back instead of focusing on Britain's future.

The Tory chief said: "The year is 2026 yet the Prime Minister said in his statement that everything has gone wrong since the 1980s, still complaining about Margaret Thatcher. He is talking about a woman who became Prime Minister before I was born."

Setting out his Left-wing vision for the country, the Labour leader blamed "a series of wrong turns" in the past 40 years for sluggish economic growth.

Mr Burnham was facing MPs for the first time since he ousted Sir Keir Starmer

ANDY Burnham promised a fresh start for Britain, as Nigel Farage broke Commons rules on his first day back.

In his debut speech to MPs as Prime Minister, Mr Burnham vowed the next decade would be better than the last. He added: "We can let Britain believe again."

Meanwhile, Reform boss Mr Farage, heckled as he returned after his by-election farce, filmed on the roof of Parliament.
