PRINCE Harry and the King have spoken since the Sussex family returned to the UK, the Daily Express understands.

Sources close to the Duke made clear father and son spoke within the first week of his arrival in the Cotswolds, after a conflicting report

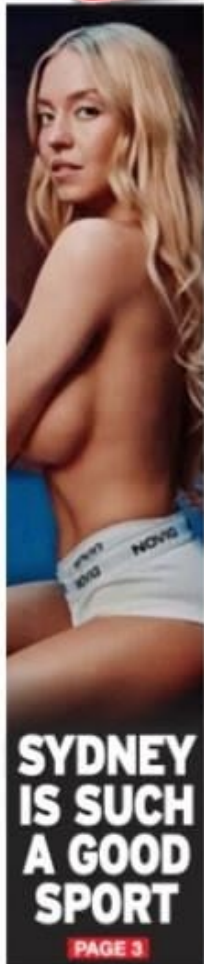

“△ **Byline extractor misses (10 Sep 2026):** the pipeline caught only the Express byline. Direct vision reads of the saved covers found two more that `extract_bylines` missed with no error — Mirror "BY DAVE BURKE" (in the main headline block beside the Farage photo) and Star "by KATE NELSON" (attribution box beside the Terminator graphic). Both are researched below.

Wikipedia REST API check: no usable entries — `Emily_Ferguson` resolves to Emily Murphy, the Canadian women's-rights activist and first female magistrate in the British Empire (name mismatch, discarded); `Dave_Burke` → David Burke, British actor, d. May 2026 (mismatch, discarded); `Kate_Nelson` → no journalist entry.

- **Emily Ferguson** (Royal Editor) — cover story byline ("EXCLUSIVE BY EMILY FERGUSON Royal Editor") **Bio:** Emily Ferguson is the Royal Editor at the Daily Express, based in London. She covers the Royal Family's engagements at home and abroad, and has reported from Nepal with the Duke and Duchess of Edinburgh and on the King and Queen's tour of Australia and Samoa. She joined the company in 2018 as a news reporter, later became a weekend editor, left in 2021 for the *i* newspaper as a political reporter, and returned to the Express in January 2023 to lead the royal beat. She regularly appears on BBC Wales and BBC Radio Ulster discussing royal news. Daily Mirror

- **Dave Burke** (Political Correspondent) — cover story byline ("BY DAVE BURKE"; **missed by the byline extractor**) **Bio:** Dave Burke is a Political Correspondent based in the Daily Mirror's Westminster office in Parliament. He joined the paper's politics team in mid-2022, in time for the Conservative Party leadership contest that made Liz Truss PM, and covered the second Tory leadership contest a few weeks later. He now covers the Home Office, scrutinising a Labour government. His recent output centres on Reform UK — the party's donations row, its conference, and Nigel Farage's handling of both — and on Labour's migration and prison policy. **Controversies:** None found in public-record searches.

- **Kate Nelson** (staff writer) — cover story byline ("by KATE NELSON"; **missed by the byline extractor**) **Bio:** No published bio found. Her Daily Star author archive shows her covering AI/tech, cost-of-living, showbiz and celebrity news, plus a widely-picked-up study story on DIY skills, but the paper publishes no staff biography or job title for her.
