- **Richard Ashmore** (Senior News Reporter, Express.co.uk) — cover story, printed as "EXCLUSIVE BY RICHARD ASHMORE" **Bio:** Richard Ashmore is a senior news reporter at Express.co.uk covering human-interest and foreign news, with a particular focus on Israel, the war in Ukraine and ISIS operations in Syria and Afghanistan. He has previously worked at the Daily Mail, the Mail on Sunday and the Sunday Express, and extensively for press agencies in the UK and Australia; he has been named Newcomer of the Year and Reporter of the Year at regional press awards. In 2022 he travelled to Syria to interview British ISIS brides including Shamima Begum, and to Ukraine with an animal charity to rescue a circus bear called Masha trapped by the invasion; he returned to Syria in 2025 to report on the rise of ISIS and spoke to survivors of the 7 October atrocity in Israel. **Controversies:** None found in public-record searches — no IPSO ruling, correction or press row naming him. One adjacent press-row item, noted for completeness: he wrote the Express's 5 Aug 2026 report on Cambridge professor Jason Arday resigning amid plagiarism allegations, which a NewsCord media-criticism audit counted among the 11 Express articles it logged before Arday's death as part of a 229-article national "pile-on". That audit's finding is aimed at the coverage as a whole, not at Ashmore personally, and no complaint or ruling against him arises from it. **Sources:** [Express journalist profile](#), [Muck Rack profile](#),

- **Lizzy Buchan** (Political Editor) — cover story byline **Bio:** Lizzy Buchan is the Mirror's Political Editor, overseeing its Parliamentary team covering Westminster and the country. She has covered politics since 2017 and joined the Mirror in 2020 as a political correspondent, rising to deputy online political editor and then deputy political editor; she was appointed permanent political editor on 18 December 2024 after an interim stint following John Stevens's departure. Before the Mirror she spent four years working in Parliament, first as a PA Media reporter and then as a political correspondent at The Independent, having begun her career at Cambridge News and spent two and a half years at The Scotsman as a reporter and health correspondent. She also hosts the Mirror's The Division Bell podcast. **Controversies:** None found in public-record searches — no IPSO ruling, correction or press row naming her (`site:ipso.co.uk` returns nothing for her; IPSO rulings name publications, not reporters). Positive public record: she won a Flame of Hope Award in 2016 for cancer coverage while at The Scotsman, and a national journalism award nomination cited "her modest demeanour belies her steely determination to dig out stories". **Sources:** [Mirror author page](#), [Muck Rack profile](#), [Press Gazette: Lizzy Buchan appointed Mirror political editor](#), [Press Gazette: Who are the UK's political editors?](#)

Daily Star

- **James Cabooter** (TV & Showbiz Editor) — cover story byline, printed as "by JAMES CABOOTER" **Bio:** No published bio found. The Daily Star's own author page is an article archive with no bio text, and his Muck Rack profile carries no job title (it lists him as a Daily Star (UK) and Express Newspaper journalist). His LinkedIn headline reads "Off the Record Editor, Daily Star"; Wikipedia's Daily Star article describes him as editor of the paper's daily gossip column, *Wired*; today's cover credits him as TV & Showbiz Editor. He covers showbiz, TV and music, with a recent run of Oasis reunion and 2027 tour stories. **Controversies:** None found in public-record searches — no IPSO ruling, correction or press row naming him. **Sources:** [Daily Star author page](#), [Muck Rack profile](#), [Wikipedia: Daily Star \(United Kingdom\)](#), [LinkedIn profile](#), [Prowly profile](#)

Byline-extractor artefacts discarded this run (not people): "Last Night No Labour Mp Had Responded" and "Sport Aces For" (sub-headline fragments captured as bylines), "James Cabooter Tv" (job title fused to the name), and "& Amy Niall" (a first-pass vision artefact — the clean re-read of the Star cover gives "BY JAMES CABOOTER TV & Showbiz Editor" only, and no Daily Star reporter by that name appears on the paper's author indexes). No Wikipedia articles exist for any of the three bylines — the REST summary API returns "Internal error" for Richard Ashmore, Lizzy Buchan and James Cabooter, so the usual notability traps (the Swindon North MP "Will Stone", the American cartoonist "Russell Myers") do not apply and no mismatched extract was accepted.
