ANDY Burnham will drag Britain back to the 1970s as brutal tax rises spark a winter of discontent, Kemi Badenoch warns.

The Conservative leader said that families will pay the price for Labour's economic failures as the government desperately tries to balance the books.

Difficult

It came as the Prime Minister spoke of "difficult decisions" after inflation rose to 3.1%, with warnings it could top 4% next year.

Writing in the Daily Express, Mrs Badenoch blasted: "Old-fashioned tax-and-spend socialism risks becoming an old-fashioned Labour

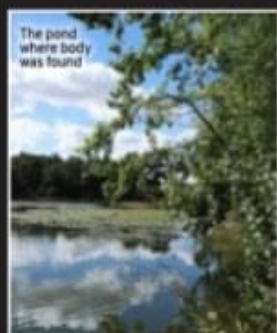

A BODY has been found in the hunt for a missing three-year-old boy following a huge search operation.

Hundreds of volunteers came from miles around to look for Noah Woods, who disappeared on Tuesday.

Autistic, non-verbal and partially deaf.

he had run down an alleyway from a playground while out with a relative.

Police said yesterday a child's body had been discovered in a nearby pond.

It came after his dad Rhys made a plea for help, saying "I cannot go another night knowing he's out there alone."

“△ **Byline correction.** The pipeline's first vision pass read this byline as "BY AMY JAMES Chief Reporter" — an artefact. Two independent checks confirm **Andy Lines**: (a) the pipeline's own clean re-run of `frontpage-vision.py` on the saved cover and a zoomed `vision_analyze` crop both read "ANDY LINES Chief Reporter"; (b) `https://www.mirror.co.uk/authors/andy-lines/` returns HTTP 200 while `https://www.mirror.co.uk/authors/amy-james/` returns 404. "Amy James" was discarded and not researched. (Wikipedia's "Amy James" is an Australian rower — an unrelated namesake.)

“⚠ **Byline correction.** The pipeline read the surname as "Greenan"; `vision_analyze` read "GRENNAN". Corroborated as **Dan Grennan**: `https://www.dailystar.co.uk/authors/dan-grennan/` returns HTTP 200 (dan-greenan → 404), and his author page carries the Putney Pusher story itself ("Putney pusher suspect found dead at home at 44 as Royal background uncovered").

Daily Express

- **Martyn Brown** (Political Editor) — cover story byline **Bio:** Martyn Brown is Political Editor of the Daily Express and Sunday Express, promoted from deputy political editor in November 2024 when Sam Lister moved up to associate editor. A lobby correspondent in Parliament since 2010, he covers British, European and US politics from Westminster, and spent three years as a journalist and media trainer in Myanmar, covering the country's first free general election in 2015 and the 2017 Rohingya genocide. **Controversies:** Media-criticism column *Rats in a Sack* (The New World) has twice targeted his access-led interview style as "absurdly sycophantic" — over a day spent on the campaign trail with Nigel Farage (Apr 2026) and with Kemi Badenoch in Croydon (May 2026), where it says his "unkind colleagues" nickname him "Martyn Brown-Nose" and accuses him of printing no substantive answers. Daily Mirror

- **Andy Lines** (Chief Reporter) — cover story byline **Bio:** Andy Lines is chief reporter of the Daily Mirror, first joining the paper in 1995 and rejoining as chief reporter in 2013 after a spell as its US Editor. He covered 9/11 in New York (winning awards for that reporting) and has since reported on 7/7, Grenfell, the Bataclan and Columbine attacks, plus assignments in Somalia, Ukraine and Yemen; his reports from inside war-torn Yemen won him Amnesty International's news reporter of the year award in 2019. He secured a world exclusive interview with Bill Clinton in 2001, has interviewed Mother Teresa, Mike Tyson, John McCain and Tim Peake, and in June 2016 boarded the England team's bus at Euro 2016, exposing a security breach. **Controversies:** Named as co-author (with Rebecca Younger) of the Mirror's 4 August 2014 front-page exclusive "EBOLA TERROR AS PASSENGER DIES AT GATWICK". The woman had not died of Ebola and had died of natural causes at a hospital in Redhill, not at Gatwick; the Mirror published an apology on page 2 more than three months later. The media-campaign site Hacking Inquiry cited the article as a clear breach of the Editors' Code Clause 1 (Accuracy) and criticised the prominence and timing of the apology. - **Dan Grennan** (Audience Writer) — cover story byline **Bio:** Dan Grennan is an Audience Writer at the Daily Star, focusing on the Department for Work and Pensions, benefits, social welfare, politics, courts and breaking news. Born in Ireland, he covered Irish national politics and the Covid-19 pandemic, local authorities and breaking news before moving to London, and has also worked for MailOnline, Dublin Live, the Irish Daily Mail, the Irish Mail on Sunday and the Dublin Inquirer. Research notes

- **Wikipedia name traps:** `Martyn_Brown` resolves to a British diver, and `Amy_James` to an Australian rower (`Dan_Greenan` 404s). None matched the journalists, so all three extracts were discarded — no Wikipedia bio is cited for any byline.

- **IPSO:** `site:ipso.co.uk` searches returned no rulings naming any of the three; ipso.co.uk's own rulings search is JS-rendered and was not scraped.
- **All three bylines verified against the papers' own author pages** rather than accepted from the vision pass; two of the three pipeline readings contained name errors (Mirror "Amy James", Star "Greenan").

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
