ASYLUM seekers who could be murderers may move unchecked into the planned camp near Piddington with more freedom than protesting villagers, Kemi Badenoch has claimed.

The Tory leader was told by local women that police have advised them to run and hide if they fear danger. She said: "This is not just an immigration issue. This is a women's issue, a safeguarding issue. People will not be

Daily Express

- **Michael Knowles** — cover story byline **Bio:** Home Affairs and Defence Editor at the Daily Express, covering immigration, people smuggling, organised crime, terrorism, intelligence, policing and the military capabilities of the Armed Forces. Joined the Express as a reporter in July 2016, after reporting roles at the Watford Observer (2014–15, promoted to senior reporter); shortlisted for the Cudlipp Award in 2020 for an investigation into child trafficking in Afghanistan. **Controversies:** None found in public-record searches (no IPSO rulings, corrections or press rows attached to him). Public-record note: in March 2024 he was one of seven national-media home affairs editors who signed a joint letter of protest to the Home Office, accusing it of using publication of the 361-page Sarah Everard report to "bury bad news" on immigration — a press-access dispute, not a finding against him. Daily Mirror

- **Martin Bagot** — cover story byline **Bio:** Health and Science Editor at the Daily Mirror, responsible for the paper's health and science beat, covering medical advances from cancer to dementia and obesity in the UK and worldwide. Spent four years as a social media reporter at the Mirror before switching to health and science in 2017 and becoming Health and Science Editor two years later; previously worked in local press and freelanced for MailOnline. **Controversies:** None found in public-record searches — no IPSO rulings, corrections or press rows identified. (No published bio found on Wikipedia; no article exists for him.) **Sources:** [Mirror author page](#), [Roxhill journalist briefing](#), [Muck Rack profile](#), [ResponseSource — role change](#)

Daily Star

- **Jerry Lawton** (Chief Reporter / Chief Crime Correspondent) — cover story byline **Bio:** Daily Star Chief Reporter and Chief Crime Correspondent, at the paper for three decades. Specialisms include general UK and world news, crime, sports news (football, horse racing, darts), space, science, health and technology. Bio per the Star's own author page; also quoted in the Leveson Inquiry (Chapter 3, press and police) on off-the-record police briefings. **Controversies:** The 21 July 2010 "Grand Theft Auto: Rothbury" story — the Star reported that Rockstar Games was planning a GTA instalment based on the Raoul Moat shootings, complete with a mocked-up cover. The paper apologised on 24 July 2010, admitting it had "made no attempt to check the accuracy of the story before publication", had not contacted Rockstar beforehand, and had quoted a grieving relative of one of Moat's victims; it said it had paid "substantial" damages, which Rockstar donated to charity. Before the apology Lawton defended the story on Facebook, saying he was "baffled by the fury of adult gamers" and that he would "challenge them to a virtual reality duel....stab....I win!". Byline verification notes (discarded readings)

- **Express:** the pipeline and 3× OCR both read **Michael Knowles** (correct); a full-page `vision_analyze` read "BY MICHAEL KINNELL" — **discarded**. `https://www.express.co.uk/journalists` lists `/journalist/123184/Michael-Knowles`, and wikipedia's `Michael Knowles` page is a disambiguation list (actor, MP, film producer, rugby league player, US political commentator) with no match for this journalist — **all Wikipedia extracts discarded as notability traps**.
- **Mirror:** the pipeline and 3× OCR both read **MARTIN BAGOT** (correct); `vision_analyze` read "MARTIN BARDOT" — **discarded**. Corroborated by HTTP status: `mirror.co.uk/authors/martin-bagot/` → 200, `.../martin-bardot/` → 404.
- **Star:** the pipeline read "BY **JEREMY** LAWTON DEPUTY POLITICAL EDITOR" — **first name wrong, role unverified**; 3× OCR read "by **JERRY** LAWTON" at confidence 1.00, and `dailystar.co.uk/authors/jerry-lawton/` → 200 while `.../jeremy-lawton/` → 404. Wikipedia has no article for either name.

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
