PREGNANT women are being taught how to give birth in a car after a maternity ward shut.

North Devon District Hospital temporarily closed the wing due to staff shortages, leaving patients a near two-hour journey to Exeter.

The crisis is so bad couples are being given classes on having their baby on a motorway hard shoulder.

Mum-of-two Hannah Rulton, 37, who nearly died during a previous labour, said: "We are petrified."

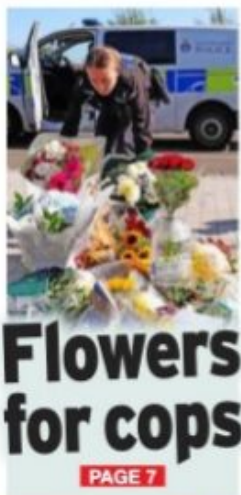
