A DIRE winter threatens OAPs as energy bills hit a three-year high, warn campaigners.

They worry that hard-up older people will have to take "drastic action" after energy regulators raised the price cap by 4% from October.

Dennis Reed, from the Silver Voices group, fears that thousands of pensioners might die prematurely from the cold. He said: "Andy Burnham needs to do much more than

“△ Byline extraction misfired this run: the Dolly sub-headline ("Singer died surrounded by loved ones after brief secret cancer battle") was mis-parsed as two fake bylines ("Loved Ones After Brief Secret Cancer Battle", "Loved Ones After"). These are not journalists and were discarded; the only named byline on the Mirror cover is Tom Bryant. Express and Star covers carried no bylines (expected).
