Number of foreign crooks due to be kicked out of Britain rises under Labour

21,294 CRIMINALS WHO SHOULD BE DEPORTED STILL ON STREETS

A RECORD 21,294 foreign criminals are roaming the streets as the deportation crisis worsens under Labour.

The number of crooks in the community has grown by 1,000 in just three months and means the total figure has more than doubled since the end of 2020.

Meanwhile, fewer than 10,000 Channel arrivals have been removed since the problem began in 2018.

Reform's Zia Yusuf said figures "show the invasion of Britain continues under

INSIDE TOWN GRIPPED BY FEAR

Nine lives lost after horror crash and deadly fire amid a brutal gang war that has left families terrified

BY JEREMY ARMSTRONG in Grangetown, near Middlesbrough

RESIDENTS are living in fear after a series of terrifying incidents in their town that have left nine dead, amid reports of a gang turf war.

After two police officers and five young men died in Saturday's A66 crash, a woman and her seven-year-old niece died in a house blaze in Grangetown, near Middlesbrough, while cars have been rammed into local homes.

With more violence feared, 200 police are being drafted in. Ex-Middlesbrough mayor Andy Preston said: "Escalation will be carnage. Communities are on their knees."
