- **UK set to announce sanctions on Israeli settlements in occupied West Bank** — Foreign Secretary Ed Miliband is expected to impose restrictions on products and services this afternoon, a move opposed by both Israel and the US. Running as a BBC live page; comes as settler attacks on Palestinian schoolchildren grow.

 - **Chancellor Healey calls for "confidence about Britain" despite "historic high" borrowing costs** — In his first major speech as chancellor (Manufacturing Technology Centre, Coventry) Healey set a mission of "good growth in every postcode", refused to rule out tax rises in his first Budget on 28 October, and unveiled a £150m fund for companies in the north of England. Shadow Chancellor Andrew Griffith said Healey "sounds increasingly like continuity Rachel Reeves".
