

Auditing Britain

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Semantic Summary

Auditing Britain is the YouTube alias of Reda Bouadi-Clifton, a Banbury-based minicab driver operating one of the UK's largest auditing channels with nearly 400,000 subscribers and over 200 million views. His content spans confrontational encounters with police, security guards, and government officials, increasingly pivoting toward asylum hotel coverage aligned with anti-migrant far-right narratives. Of Moroccan heritage, Bouadi-Clifton's identity was uncovered through Companies House records, FOI requests, and social media investigation, though the channel has never confirmed this. He has been convicted for filming inside a magistrates' court (2021), arrested in Kidderminster and Watford, assaulted at an asylum hotel in Heston, and featured in a Channel 4 News investigation into the lucrative auditor industry. He is part of the broader UK auditor network, tagging and collaborating with channels including DJ Audits, CJ Audits, and Marti Blagborough. His blend of sovereignty-focused legal-auditing with anti-immigration content places him at the intersection of the PINAC/free-speech movement and the far-right migrant-hotel protest ecosystem, embodying the auditor subculture's evolution from police accountability to anti-migrant agitation.

Overview

Auditing Britain is one of the largest UK-based auditing channels, with nearly 400,000 subscribers and over 200 million views. The anonymous creator films confrontational encounters with police, security guards, and government officials across the UK, particularly focusing on police stations, public buildings, and more recently, asylum hotels. The channel has a membership feature for exclusive content. The creator's identity has been widely reported as Reda Bouadi-Clifton, a Banbury-based minicab driver, though the channel itself has never officially confirmed this.

Identity

- Real name widely reported as **Reda Bouadi-Clifton** (also "Raider Buadi Clifton")
- Publicly identified via Facebook group "Auditing Britain Is A Joke" (January 2024)
- Confirmed as a Banbury-based minicab driver at 8 Woodhall Drive, Banbury, Oxfordshire
- FOI request to HM Courts and Tribunals Service sought his facial image (pending)
- Listed on Companies House with director appointments
- Photos circulating on TikTok showing his face
- The channel has never officially confirmed or denied this identity

Notable Content

- Auditing police stations across the UK
- Filming in public spaces and confronting security personnel
- Coverage of asylum hotels and migrant accommodation

Equipment and Style

Controversies and Incidents

- **Watford arrest** (May 2025): Arrested in Watford town centre under Section 50 of the Police Reform Act (antisocial behaviour) and suspicion of theft; footage went viral; released follow-up videos including a case against Hertfordshire Police. Bodycam footage later released by police. (Watford Observer, May 2025)
- **Kidderminster arrest** (2021): Arrested after filming Kidderminster Police Station; "locked up for five hours" (Kidderminster Shuttle)
- **Court filming conviction** (2021): Pleaded guilty to one count of taking a photograph in or around Wellingborough Magistrates' Court (27 May 2021); fined over £200
- **Assaulted at asylum hotel**: "Got jumped" outside an asylum hotel in Heston (December 2025), covered in YouTube video with 610K views
- **Featured in Channel 4 News**: Part of September 2025 investigation into asylum hotel auditors
- **Comedian Paul Choudry harassment**: Alleged to have stalked comedian Paul Choudry (per PistonHeads discussion)
- **Alleged identity exposure**: Widely identified on Facebook, TikTok, Companies House, and FOI requests
- **Moroccan heritage**: Per Reddit, he is identified as being of Moroccan origin
