

Charlie Veitch

Charles "Charlie" Veitch is a Brazilian-British YouTuber with nearly 850,000 subscribers whose trajectory spans from left-wing anarchist "Love Police" activism and 9/11 truther conspiracy content to right-wing "Broken Britain" political commentary focused on immigration, public disorder, and confrontational auditing. A former investment banker from a background of Brazilian oil wealth, Veitch was the subject of a 2014 BBC Three documentary "That Man With The Megaphone" and later publicly renounced his conspiracy theories after speaking with architects and engineers, triggering backlash from Alex Jones. His current content positions him among the larger UK auditor-adjacent creators, with a focus on Manchester — where he faces bail conditions banning him from the city centre following a Section 4A public order charge — and Nottingham, which he portrayed as a dangerous "hellhole." He collaborates with English Ned (Chris Messenger), appearing in joint videos that frame British cities as sites of immigration-driven decay. His evolution from anarchist prankster to right-wing grievance merchant mirrors a broader pipeline from anti-establishment counterculture to anti-migrant content creation, with his domestic abuse allegations and multiple arrests illustrating the criminal-legal patterns common among figures in the auditor ecosystem.

Charles Veitch is a prominent UK-based YouTuber and former conspiracy theorist who has evolved into a right-wing political commentator and "auditor." With nearly 850,000 subscribers, he is one of

the most well-known figures in the UK auditing scene. Veitch documents what he calls "Broken Britain," with particular emphasis on immigration, public order issues, and confrontations with authorities. He has a Wikipedia page and has been featured in mainstream media including BBC Three. He has also been the subject of a Daily Mail feature profiling his transition from investment banker to viral content creator.

Background

- Former investment banker turned activist; reportedly comes from a background of Brazilian oil wealth
- Early activism (2010): Part of the "Love Police" movement, describing himself as an "absurdist filmmaker"
- Charged with impersonating a police officer in June 2010
- Featured in BBC Three documentary "That Man With The Megaphone" (2014), directed by Mohnish Patel for the BBC Fresh Online project
- Became a prominent 9/11 truther and conspiracy theorist; later publicly renounced those views after speaking with architects, engineers, and victims' relatives for a BBC investigation — leading to backlash from Alex Jones and Infowars
- Shifted to right-wing political commentary and "Broken Britain" content from ~2022 onward

Controversies and Legal Issues

- **December 2025 arrest:** Arrested on 24 December 2025 after an allegation was made against him
- **February 2026 charges:** Charged with a Section 4A public order offence by Greater Manchester Police
- **Bail conditions:** Banned from entering Manchester city centre inside the ring road; set to appear at Manchester Magistrates' Court on 30 June 2026
- **Domestic abuse allegations:** Listed on Red Rose UK as a domestic abuser; ex-partner alleges she experienced severe emotional abuse and physical assault for which Veitch pleaded guilty and faced legal consequences. Multiple women have come forward with allegations of manipulation and abusive behaviour
- **Trafford Centre incident:** Alleged to have attacked a couple (who were with their child) at the Trafford Centre; featured in a Daily Mail article about a father who attacked Veitch inside the mall and was found guilty of common assault
- **Public order offences:** Multiple arrests and charges throughout his career
- **2015 fine:** Fined after clash with BNP supporters at a cuts protest (Manchester Evening News)
- **Royal wedding incident:** Masked anarchists (including Veitch) thwarted by police
- **Nelson statue controversy:** Criticized the Nelson monument in a YouTube video (Lancashire Telegraph)
- **Harassment allegations:** Reddit users report him filming ambulances and confronting families during emergencies
