

Society X

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Semantic Summary

Society X is a UK-based YouTube channel run by an operator named Jamie that occupies the collaborative, live-stream-driven end of the right-wing protest-coverage and auditor ecosystem. The channel produces regular live shows including "Society X Late Night Live" and "Society X Sunday - Open Panel" with viewer participation, distinguishing it from the solo-auditor format through its emphasis on panel discussions and guest appearances. Society X collaborates with figures including Marti Blagborough — the self-styled "Godfather of UK Auditing" — and appears alongside channels like UK Meet The Tyrants, situating it within the Yorkshire and national network of protest-coverage creators. The channel's unusual content-removal policy — its description invites anyone "changing their mind and wanting the video removed" to email — suggests it films individuals who may later object, a practice typical of auditor channels that generate content through confrontational encounters with members of the public. Content featuring police bodycam footage and "anti-white UK police" narratives aligns Society X with the broader right-wing "two-tier policing" discourse common across the auditor and protest-media scene. The channel's reliance on Buy Me a Coffee for live-stream support via JamieSociety reflects the monetisation model typical of mid-tier creators in this space who lack the subscriber counts for significant YouTube ad revenue.

Overview

Society X is a UK-based YouTube channel (@SocietyXUK) focused on right-wing/anti-establishment content, protest coverage, and live streaming. The channel runs regular live shows including "Society X Late Night Live" and "Society X Sunday - Open Panel" where viewers can join and participate. The channel appears to be run by someone named Jamie (referenced in Buy Me a Coffee account as JamieSociety).

The channel description notes: "Anyone changing their mind and wanting the video removed please email contactsocietyx@gmail.com" — suggesting content involves filming individuals who may later object to being featured.

Controversies

- Part of the wider UK right-wing YouTube/protest coverage ecosystem
- Channel description notes that people can request video removal via email, suggesting content involves filming individuals who may later object
- Video removal policy is unusual for a political/protest channel — typically this approach is used by auditor channels to manage complaints about being filmed without consent
- Collaborates with Marti Blagborough and other figures in the auditor space
