

UK Auditor

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Semantic Summary

UK Auditor (also known as "Power To The Proletariat," a name derived from George Orwell's Nineteen Eighty-Four) is a small-scale YouTube auditing channel with approximately 3,040 subscribers that stands apart from the dominant right-wing and anti-migrant orientation of the UK auditor scene. The channel's left-wing branding — reflected in its Orwellian name — and its focus on traditional police-accountability auditing of police stations and government buildings rather than migrant hotel protests distinguish it from the network of auditors documented by HOPE not hate, Reuters, and Channel 4 News. Reddit's r/AmlFreeToGo community has praised its operator's police interactions as a "masterclass in controlling the conversation" and "flawless victory," indicating tactical skill in the confrontational encounters that define auditing. Content includes filming job centres and exposing GDPR breaches, alongside street-level encounters with police and security in locations including Bethnal Green, London. The channel's small subscriber count and its departure from the anti-migrant pivot that many auditor channels made in 2024–2025 place it at the margins of the politically significant auditor ecosystem. Its existence serves as a reminder that "auditing" as a practice is not inherently right-wing — though the overwhelming majority of high-profile UK auditors documented in this collection operate within far-right or anti-migrant frameworks, UK Auditor demonstrates a small counter-current rooted in left-libertarian or anarchist traditions of police accountability.

UK Auditor (@UKAuditor, joined June 2024, 3K subscribers) is notable within the UK auditing ecosystem for its apparent left-wing orientation — a rarity in a scene overwhelmingly dominated by far-right anti-migrant content. The channel, associated with the name "Power To The Proletariat" (a reference to Orwell's Nineteen Eighty-Four), focuses on traditional police-accountability auditing: filming outside police stations, documenting GDPR breaches at job centres, and asserting public filming rights. Its content has been praised on r/AmlFreeToGo as a "masterclass in controlling the conversation" and a "flawless victory" in police encounters. Unlike the vast majority of UK auditing channels that pivoted to migrant hotel confrontations during 2024–2025, UK Auditor has maintained a police-and-institution accountability focus, with no documented migration-related content. The channel's small subscriber base (3K) and left-wing branding distinguish it from the right-wing auditor mainstream, but its participation in the same format and assertion of the same PINAC-rights framework places it within the broader auditing phenomenon. Its existence

Overview

UK Auditor is a small-scale UK-based YouTube auditing channel that describes its content as: "Join me as I explore, audit, and uncover the truth in public spaces across the UK. My channel focuses on promoting transparency, accountability, and free speech through public audits and engaging content."

The channel was created on **25 June 2024** and has approximately **3,040 subscribers** with around **361,000 total video views** as of June 2026, making it one of the smaller UK auditor channels.

The channel appears to have a left-wing / anarchist branding, with Reddit posts referencing the channel under the name "**Power To The Proletariat**" — a name derived from George Orwell's *Nineteen Eighty-Four*. The r/AmlFreeToGo community has posted about the channel, describing its police encounters as "masterclass in controlling the conversation" and "flawless victory."

Notable Content

- Auditing of police stations and government buildings (Bethnal Green, London)
- Filming job centres and exposing GDPR breaches by poorly run offices
- Street-level encounters with police and security guards
- Educational content about filming rights in public spaces

Controversies

Association Questions

- Unlike many UK auditor channels that have pivoted to anti-migrant content, UK Auditor (Power To The Proletariat) appears to have maintained a more traditional "auditing" focus on police accountability rather than migrant hotel protests.

Style

- Described on urban75 forums as having a "left-wing" orientation compared to the generally right-wing UK auditor scene
- One Reddit comment noted: "TBF the original channel this came from is called 'Power to the Proletariat' so sadly that sort of crazy is partially baked in already"

- The r/AmIFreeToGo community highlighted his interactions with police as particularly skilful, with one thread titled "Masterclass in controlling the conversation during a police encounter."
