UK-registered charity founded by Maya Forstater after her 2021 tribunal win. Central policy-influence engine of UK gender-critical movement. Key personnel: Maya Forstater (exec director), Helen Joyce (advocacy director), Fiona McAnena, Helen Staniland. Campaigns: single-sex spaces, Conversion Practices Bill opposition, NHS ward segregation. Funded by JK Rowling's JKRWF and opaque charitable donations. Direct government access to Conservative MPs (Danny Kruger). Described as "pro-HRA political lobby group disguised as women's rights charity." Background

Sex Matters was founded by Maya Forstater following her landmark 2021 employment tribunal appeal, which established that gender-critical beliefs are protected under the Equality Act 2010. The organisation positions itself as a human-rights charity focused on sex-based rights. It achieved charitable status and has become one of the most politically influential gender-critical organisations in the UK, with direct access to government ministers and regular citation in policy documents.

Timeline

- **2022:** Founded by Maya Forstater
- **2023:** Helen Joyce (former Economist journalist, author of *Trans: When Ideology Meets Reality*) joined as director of advocacy
- **2024:** Achieved registered charitable status; expanded team with Fiona McAnena and Helen Staniland as directors
- **Jan 2026:** Legal challenge over trans access to Hampstead Heath ladies' pond — blocked by judge who ruled the claim should be brought by an individual, not a charity
- **2026:** Active in opposing the Conversion Practices Bill; advocating for single-sex spaces in NHS hospitals
- **Jun 2026:** Campaigning against Equality Minister Olivia Bailey's proposed bill on conversion practices, claiming it criminalises parents and teachers who "protect children from irreversible sex changes"

Key Campaigns

- **Single-sex spaces:** Legal challenges and policy advocacy to exclude trans women from women's facilities (Hampstead ponds, NHS wards, prisons, sports)
- **Conversion Practices Bill opposition:** Framing the proposed bill as criminalising "safeguarding children" — a key current campaign
- **Women's Institute:** Supported WI's decision (Dec 2025) to bar trans members
- **Scottish government:** Threatened legal action over single-sex policies (Yahoo News, Jun 2026)
- **Prison policy:** Campaigning for "no males on single-sex wards" — Baroness Nicholson's petition in the Lords

Funding

- **JK Rowling** — aligned; Rowling's JKRF (launched May 2025) provides private legal funding that overlaps with Sex Matters' work
- Charitable donations — registered UK charity status allows Gift Aid
- Criticised for lack of transparency: Bluesky counter-discourse notes Sex Matters and LGB Alliance "can never tell us where their funding comes from" (Jul 2026)

Political Influence

- Regular citation in parliamentary debates and government consultations

- Lemkin Institute (Jun 2025) analysis: Sex Matters has shaped UK policy through "exploitation of the law to propagate bigotry" — documenting how the organisation uses legal challenges to shift government guidance on single-sex spaces
- Direct access to Conservative MPs (Danny Kruger) and media platforms (Telegraph, Times, GB News)
- Cabinet-level access: Ex-Downing Street advisor described them as a "pro-HRA political lobby group in the form of a women's rights charity"
